

Create an account

Your students, students or anyone else you invite to your Celluloid projects do not need to register. They will simply connect with the project code you will provide them (see below). In accordance with our terms of use, we do not collect any information about participants in Celluloid projects.

On the other hand, if you want to create a project and share it, you must identify yourself, because you are responsible for the content and exchanges that will be found there.

To create a project, you must first create an account by clicking on the "registration" button:

Registration Form

When you register, you will be asked for a user name, this name will serve as your login ID but also as a pseudonym, visible to the participants of your project. Please note that it cannot be modified later. You will also need to provide a valid email address and a password that you will need to keep.

Password format

The password must contain at least 8 characters. The use of passwords that include numbers and special characters is not recommended.

Confirmation of the email address

After completing the form you will receive an email to the address provided, containing a 6-digit code. You will be asked to complete your registration. Be careful not to close the window until the address is confirmed, otherwise you will have to repeat the operation with a new address.

Login to the site

Once you have created your account, you are logged in and can create your first project. In case of disconnection, you can reconnect with this button. The login button is located next to the registration button.

For project creators, your identifiers are the ones you entered at registration. For simple participants, it is your username and the project code in which you are participating.

Create a project

To create a project, you must be registered and connected (see previous steps). You then have to choose the video around which you want to collaborate for your project. Selecting a video

The site only supports (for the moment) Youtube videos, so go to YouTube first and find the video of your choice. All you have to do is retrieve the address (URL) of the video:

Import the video to Celluloid

Back on the Celluloid homepage, paste the Youtube link (right click then "paste" or Ctrl+V) in the project creation field.

All you have to do is click on the new project button. This will open the project creation form.

Project creation form

Title

This is the title you choose to describe your project, which may therefore be different from the title of the video.

Description (of the video)

In this field, you are invited to give the information you want about the content of the video. These two fields, as well as your nickname, will be those displayed in the project list if you make it public.

Objective

Description of the general pedagogical objective of your project

Proposed activities / exercises

This section allows you to detail your instructions and to break down the above objective. Attention, to validate an activity, you must click on the + ("More") button to the right of the field.

Domains

Click on the tabs to enter the keywords corresponding to your project. These keywords will serve as search filters for public projects on the home page.

Level

You can enter a range of educational levels corresponding to the project.

Sharing

The "Public" button allows you to make the project visible on the home page. The "Collaborative" button allows you to allow participants to annotate and comment on the project. These options can be modified later, from the page of your project.

There are several sharing configurations:

- No Public / No Collaborative / No Shared: the project is only visible and annotable by its creator.

- No Public / No Collaborative / Shared: the project does not appear in the list on the Celluloid homepage, and will only be visible to participants to whom you share the project code. However, in this case, only the project creator (you) can annotate it. Participants can see the video, your annotations and comments, but cannot answer them.

- Non-Public / Collaborative / Shared: as in the previous case, only participants and the creator can access the project, but they can all actively participate (annotate and freely comment on the video).

- Public: The same cases apply, but the project also appears in the list of public projects. In this case, any user of the site will be able to see the project (but if they do not have the code, they will not be able to participate, nor will they be able to see the participants or the annotations).

Project page

Once the form has been completed and validated, you are redirected to the project you have just created.

On this page, you will see the video of the project, as well as the information and instructions you have associated with it.

Sharing the project

If you click on the share button, a confirmation window will appear. A code will be provided to you, which you can send to all the people you want to invite. You can also print a pedagogical sheet, which explains to the students how to join the project and which includes its objectives.

Annotation of a video

Once you are a member of the project, you can start annotating it. To add an annotation, click on the "pencil" button at the bottom right of the video. This will open a banner on the video, allowing you to create a new annotation. When you have clicked on the pen, the orange arrows adjust when your annotation appears and disappears from the video. The "pause" option, if checked, pauses the video when your annotation appears when the video is played back by the participants. Once the annotation is ready, click on the green validation button to the right of the annotation to validate it and make it visible to participants. The cross allows you to cancel the current annotation. A bubble at the bottom of the video frame indicates the number of annotations created.

Editing or deleting an annotation

Your annotation now appears on the chosen sequence.

As the author of an annotation you can modify it by clicking on the green pen that appears on the annotation, or delete it with the orange trash can.

Comments on the report

By clicking on an annotation, you display the comments that will be added to it by the participants, as well as a banner allowing you to add a new one. Comments can be modified by their author, as can annotations.

Use by learners

In order for your students to use the site, start by creating a collaborative project and enable the sharing feature. From then on, on the project page, you will see the sharing code that you must communicate to your students as well as a link to the pedagogical sheet.
